2nd Sunday of Advent. Year A. 04th December 2022

The Gospels make explicit God's Word to us, through the teachings of Jesus Christ. We are disciples of Jesus!

Gospel: Matthew 3: 1-12

In due course John the Baptist appeared; he preached in the wilderness of Judaea and this was his message: **'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.'** This was the man the prophet Isaiah spoke of when he said:

A voice cries in the wilderness Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight.

This man John wore a garment made of camel-hair with a leather belt round his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. Then Jerusalem and all Judaea and the whole Jordan district made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. But when he saw a number of Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism he said to them, 'Brood of vipers, who warned you to fly from the retribution that is coming? But if you are repentant, produce the appropriate fruit, and do not presume to tell yourselves, "We have Abraham for our father," because, I tell you, God can raise children for Abraham from these stones. Even now the axe is laid to the roots of the trees, so that **any tree which fails to produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown on the fire. I baptise you in water for repentance, but the one who follows me is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to carry his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire.** His winnowing-fan is in his hand; **he will clear his threshing-floor and gather his wheat into the barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.'**

Summary

We are reminded that the kingdom of God is close at hand and that to be a part of the kingdom, we must produce good fruit or be judged unworthy: *"any tree which fails to produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown on the fire"* and *"he will clear his*

threshing-floor and gather his wheat into the barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out."

In Conclusion



John the Baptist preaches repentance and reform. Here John even directs a particularly pointed call to repentance, to the Pharisees and Sadducees because *"any tree which fails to produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown on the fire."* John clearly alludes to the difference between his baptism and the one yet to come: *"I baptise you in water for repentance, but the one who follows me will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."* John the Baptist, also makes clear that he is the forerunner to the Messiah (Jesus): *"the one who follows me is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to carry his sandals."*

John's preaching of the coming of the Lord is a key theme of the Advent season. As John's message prepared the way for Jesus in the first century, we, too, are called to prepare ourselves for Jesus' coming, by repentance through the Sacrament of Penance/Reconciliation.



Advent Reconciliation at Nearby Parishes

We respond to John the Baptist's message, by repenting for our sins this Advent. We can follow the example of St Dismas (the "good" thief who was crucified with Jesus). Dismas was contrite and repentant (he admitted his sins and accepted his suffering). Dismas had hope and trust in the Lord's mercy - "remember me when you come into your kingdom." Jesus is merciful and forgiving, and assured Dismas of his salvation – "today you will be with me in paradise." We too can be like Dismas!

Today We Light the 2nd Purple Advent Candle

Advent is a time for pause, reflection, and preparation for the gift of God's love coming to us through the baby Jesus. The theme of the Second week of Advent is repentance and forgiveness. The second purple candle on the Advent wreath is lit as a symbol of our faith in God. We read, pray, and reflect, on God's plan for us, as foretold by the prophets and fulfilled by the life and death of Jesus, and the promise of Christ's second coming.

Note: In next week's Liturgy of the Word, Isaiah describes the glorious and triumphant coming of the Lord and the healing of all that is broken. In the 4th week of Advent, Isaiah speaks of the maiden who will conceive and give birth to one, who is **'God-is-with-us'**.

Thursday 08th December is the Feast of the Immaculate Conception

The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, means that Mary (whose conception was brought about with her father St Joachim and mother St Anne) was conceived without original sin. That's what immaculate means: without stain. Mary was pure - her soul was not stained with original sin. Mary was preserved from original sin by God's grace - from the first instant of her existence, she was in the state of sanctifying grace.
